MEMORANDUM FOR ALL WIGHTMAN NCO ACADEMY ASSIGNED SOLDIERS

SUBJECT: Commandant's Policy #19, Curfew Policy

1. The following policy prescribes the actions that all Soldiers must take when departing Camp Jackson. We are ambassadors of the U.S. to all South Koreans and must ensure we represent our country and the United States Army well.
2. Soldiers departing Camp Jackson during non-duty hours or not on official business will sign out with the Staff Duty Noncommissioned Officer (SDNCO) located in building 2137 (Headquarters Bldg). All Soldiers are required to leave a phone number when signing out for notification of emergencies or in the event they need to report back to the Chain of Command. All Soldiers must put destination on the sign out so the Chain of Command has proper accountability in case of an emergency.
3. Off-Installation curfew is from 0001-0500 from Monday through Sunday to include U.S. –observed Holidays (U.S. national holidays, USFK training holidays, and U.S. –observed ROK holidays). Unless on a pass or leave the following conditions apply, service-members must either be: (1) on a U.S. military installation or (2) off the installation in a private-residence; or (3) if TDY with lodging off the installation, in their place of lodging for the evening, Which may include a hotel room, but does not include other areas of a hotel such as the lounge, bar, casino, pool or lobby. Service members are not allowed to obtain hotel as lodging unless on TDY, leave or pass. Passes will not be used as a means to extend off post activities to the curfew time. Service members will travel in battle buddy teams and at least one member of the team will remain alcohol free and be designated as the “Thinker” for group. It will be their job to ensure good order and discipline is applied in every situation. They will be responsible to ensure curfew is met.
4. Leaders will do a monthly Soldier risk assessment to identify any possible risky behaviors; these will be maintained in local files. If identified as a possible risk, a leader must develop a plan to mitigate the risk or the Soldier will not leave the installation.
5. Travel during curfew hours directly to and from a military installation is authorized for official duty, attendance at an on-installation activity, or to attend an installation sponsored MWR/recreation event or activity.


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6. Commandant may authorize an overnight pass to service members during the work-week (0001-0500) and the weekends (0100-0500) as long as the service member does not have to work the next day and is not using the pass as a means to continue to indulge in alcoholic related events outside an installation. Curfew is still in effect throughout the duration of the pass.

7. Service member that leave an installation may have this privilege pulled due to current conditions, mission requirements and potential force protection concerns and in accordance with appropriate directives and regulations.

8. This is a punitive order and policy. Service member who fail to comply with the provisions of this order are subject to punishment under UCMJ, as well as adverse administrative action authorized by applicable laws and regulations.
