CHEF OF THE QUARTER BOARD

***This regulation supersedes Army in Korea Regulation 30-2, dated 30 June 2008.**

FOR THE COMMANDER:

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Summary. This regulation establishes policies and procedures for a competitive chef of the quarter program for Eighth Army, major subordinate commands (MSCs), and assigned units.

Summary of Change. This document has been minimally changed. A full review of its contents is not required.

Applicability. This regulation applies to all Headquarters (HQs) staff sections and subordinate commands of the Eighth Army and units in Direct Support of Eighth Army.

Supplementation. Issues for further supplements to this regulation by subordinate commands is prohibited unless prior approval is obtained from the Logistics, Food Service (IMKO-LOD-FS), Installation Management Command-Korea (IMCOM-Korea), Unit #15742, APO AP 96205-5742.

Scope. This regulation applies to all units operating dining facilities supported by IMCOM-Korea.

Records Management. Records created as a result of processes prescribed by this regulation must be identified, maintained, and disposed of according to the governing service regulation. Record titles are available on the Army Records Information Management System (ARIMS) website at <https://www.arims.army.mil>.

Suggested Improvements. The proponent of this regulation is the Logistics, Food Service (IMKO-LOD-FS) Installation Management Command Korea (IMCOM-Korea). 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Chapter 1

Introduction

1-1. Purpose

The purpose of this regulation is to establish a competitive program that:

a. Provides special recognition and reward for Soldiers who demonstrate outstanding military excellence and achievement in the performance and knowledge of Military Occupation Specialty (MOS) 92G, Food Service Specialist.

b. Adds incentives to competitive programs for Eighth Army, IMCOM-Korea, and Major Subordinate Commands, assigned units, or tenant units by adding a higher level of competition and appropriate recognition.

1-3. Explanation of Abbreviations and Terms

Abbreviations and terms used in this regulation are located in the glossary.

1-4. Responsibilities

a. Commanders and/or Food Program Managers from the commands identified in paragraph 6a will:

(1) Establish criteria, policies, and procedures to select a nominee in each category, Private through Specialist and Corporal through Staff Sergeant, to appear before the Army in Korea Chef of the Quarter Board.

(2) Ensure that the competition receives positive publicity and that all eligible personnel are afforded the opportunity to participate.

(3) Select nominees and submit these required documents:

(a) Weapons Card

(b) IMCOM-Korea data sheet

(c) Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT) Scorecard

(d) Memo by Commander that candidate is not pending actions under the UCMJ

(e) Enlisted Records Brief (ERB)

(f) Photograph for Cover Page (Class A uniform, 8 X 10 inches)

(4) Ensure that all nominees meet the administrative requirements (i.e., preparing the nominees for the Army in Korea board, obtaining transportation, and temporary duty orders), as applicable.

(5) The President of the board will be the Food Service (FS) Sergeant Major. In his or her absence, The FS SGM will appoint a designated representative.

b. The IMCOM-Korea Food Service Supervisor, Food Service Branch, will:

(1) Prepare and disseminate a memorandum announcing the date, time, and location of the IMCOM-Korea Chef of the Quarter Board.

(2) Prepare and forward a memorandum announcing winners and runners-up through Command channels.

(3) Coordinate and prepare, as applicable, awards to present to the Army in Korea Chef of the Quarter winners and runners-up. Appropriated funds will be used to purchase the trophies and similar devices to be awarded IAW AR 600-8-22, chap 11.

Chapter 2 Policy and Procedures

2-1. Eligibility

a. All food service personnel with the rank of Private through Staff Sergeant that are assigned to the Major Subordinate Commands indicated in subparagraph 2-2a are eligible.

b. Competition will be in two categories:

(1) Private through Specialist.

(2) Corporal through Staff Sergeant.

c. Winners are only able to compete once per FY. All others to include runner-ups can participate throughout FY.

d. Minimum of eight attendees (4 in each category CPL to SSG and PVT to SPC) or the board will not convene.

2-2. Procedures

a. Nominees from the following Commands will compete at the Army in Korea board:

(1) USAG-Red Cloud (USAG-RC)

- (2) USAG-Yongsan (USAG-Y)
- (3) USAG-Humphreys (USAG-H)
- (4) USAG-Daegu (USAG-D)

b. Individuals assigned to the above listed Commands will compete IAW the Command channels responsible for operating the facility. Unit Food Service personnel not assigned to the above Commands will compete through their respective Garrisons. For example, nominees from units located on USAG-Y will be submitted through USAG-Y as indicated above.

c. The board will consist of the USAG Food Management NCO, or designated representative as president; and Food Service Supervisors from each Area Commands listed in subparagraph 2-2a above, as voting members.

d. A percentage system will be implemented for the winners and runner-ups.

e. Board will have both a written and oral portion

2-3. Candidate Selection

a. Soldiers will be questioned by the Army inKorea board in areas concerning the MOS and Soldier skills.

b. Nominees and Supervisors will wear Class A uniform IAW AR 670-1.

c. The uniform for board members will be Class B or as designated by the president of the board. Uniforms will be worn IAW AR 670-1.d. Nominees will be questioned on the following categories:

(1) MOS related areas:

- (a) AR 30-22, 10 May 2005 (The Army Food Program).
- (b) DA PAM 30-22, 6 February 2007 (Operating Procedures for the Army Food Program).
- (c) AK Supplement 1 to AR 30-22, 8 August 2007 (The Army Food Program).
- (d) FM 10-23, 18 April 1996 (Basic Doctrine for Army Field Feeding and Class I Operations Management).
- (e) FM 10-23-2, 30 September 1993 (Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Garrison Food Preparation and Class I Operations Management).
- (f) STP 10-92G25-SM-TG, 1 April 2004 (Soldier's Manual and Trainer's Guide for MOS 92G Food Service Specialist Skill Levels 2/3/4/5).
- (g) STP 10-92G1-SM-TG, 9 April 2003 (Soldier's Manual and Trainer's Guide for Food Service Specialist MOS 92G Skill Level 1).
- (h) Army Food Management Information System (AFMIS) Operations (Corporal through Staff Sergeant Category only).

(2) Military leadership areas:

- (a) FM 6-22, 12 October 2006 (Army Leadership).
- (b) FM 7-0, 22 October 2002 (Training the Force).
- (c) FM 7-1, 30 September 1990 (Battle Focused Training).
- (d) STP 21-1 SMCT, 2 October 2006 (Soldier's Manual of Common Tasks, Warrior Skills Level 1).

2-4. Awards

a. Winners in each category will receive a Plaque, and Certificate of Achievement from the Commanding General, IMCOM-Korea.

b. Runners-up in each category will receive a Plaque, Certificate of Achievement from the Commanding General, IMCOM-Korea.

c. All awards must be purchased with appropriated funds, per AR 600-8-22, paragraph 11-4.

2-5. Funding

IMCOM-Korea (IMKO-LOD-FS) will make arrangements to fund the awards as appropriate.
