Command Sponsorship



- Command Sponsorship is not limited by position
- Units no longer have numbers assigned except for Key Billets
- Battalion Commander or designated authority recommends approval
- Area I Specifics
 - Signed Benefits Limitation Memo
 - Approved OHA Secretarial Waiver
- Brigade Commanders are disapproval authorities
- Units have 5 days to process
- 65th Medical determines EFMP supportability
- IMCOM-K determines installation supportability
- Command Sponsorship Requirements
 - Soldier must serve the Accompanied Tour Length
 - Dependents must serve at least 12 months
 - Korea extension policy (3 years no OIF/4 years with OIF) adjudicated first
 - MPD will extend Soldiers' DEROS to meet requirements
 - IPCOT for Command Sponsorship must be for Accompanied Tour Length



Documents Required for Command Sponsorship



Out-of-Country Request

- **DA Form 4787 R** – Reassignment Processing.
- **DA Form 5888 R** (Sep 02) Family Member Deployment Screening Sheet (*valid for one year from signature in block #11e. Block #8 must be authenticated by the S-1 and have the appropriate EFMP stamp.*)
- **DD Form 2792** (Nov 06) - Exceptional Family Member Medical Summary (*Only if a family member is enrolled or warrants enrollment in EFMP.*)
- **DD Form 2792-1** (Nov 06) Individual Education Program (IEP) and Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP)- Exceptional Family Member Special Education/Early Intervention Summary (*If a family member is enrolled or warrants enrollment in EFMP; in addition to the DD 2792-1, a current IEP or IFSP is required as well.*)
- If Soldier is assigned to Area I provide **either benefits limitation counseling memorandum** as per USFK Policy Letter #26 or approved **Overseas Housing Allowance (OHA) Secretarial Waiver** if Soldier is requesting to reside in Area II.

In-Country Request

- **Memorandum** from Soldier requesting Command Sponsorship with Battalion Commander Endorsement.
- If Soldier is assigned to Area I provide **either benefits limitation counseling memorandum** as per USFK Policy Letter #26 or approved **Overseas Housing Allowance (OHA) Secretarial Waiver** if Soldier is requesting to reside in Area II.
- Original **PCS Orders & Pin-point Orders.**
- **DA Form 5888 R** (Sep 02) - Family Member Deployment Screening Sheet (*valid for one year from signature block #11e. The DA 5888 must be completed by S-1 (authenticated in block #8) and then forwarded to EFMP office for signature in block #11 appropriate Army EFMP Medical Review stamp affixed in the upper right hand corner.*)
- **DD Form 2792** (Nov 06) - Exceptional Family Member Medical Summary (*Only if a family member is enrolled or warrants enrollment in EFMP.*)
- **DD Form 2792-1** (Nov 06)- Exceptional Family Member Special Education/ Early Intervention Summary (*Only if a family a member is enrolled or warrants enrollment in EFMP; current IEP or IFSP is required for all educational enrollments.*)
- **ERB/ORB.**

Note: DA Form 7246 (EFMP Screening Questionnaire) is only required if family is being screened in Korea. Once DA Form 5888 is complete, medical officials retain DA Form 7246.



EUSA Command Sponsorship Processing Procedures



- Soldier not guaranteed Command Sponsorship until EUSA approves
- Out of Country Process is 14 Working Days
- In-Country Process is 7 Working Days after submission from Unit S1



Relocation of Dependents for Soldiers Currently in Korea



Soldiers who are currently assigned to Korea in one of the areas listed in Para 4 above **WHERE AN ACCOMPANIED TOUR WAS NOT PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED** may apply for command sponsorship and have Government transportation of dependents to the Soldiers duty station, regardless of **WHETHER THEY WERE PREVIOUSLY RELOCATED TO A DESIGNATED PLACE**. Soldiers will serve the longer of either the prescribed accompanied tour or 12 months from the date command sponsorship is approved.

- Soldiers requesting new CS, include in In-Country request memo
- Soldiers with approved but not executed CS orders submit memo to MPD requesting amendment
- Reimbursement for previous moves not authorized

Assignment Incentive Pay (AIP)

➤ **\$10,800** - Soldiers who elect to serve a 36-month Accompanied tour in Pyeongtaek, Osan, Daegu, and Seoul will receive \$300 per month for the duration of the tour.



➤ **\$7,200** - Soldiers who elect to serve a 24-month Accompanied tour in Dongducheon and Uijeongbu will receive \$300 per month for the duration of the tour.

Schools Report



- USFK directed tasking
- Intent is to provide DoDEA accurate estimate of school population for SY 10 to maximize Command Sponsorship opportunities
- Survey pre-arrival Service Members to determine registration of school age children (K-12th grade) for SY 10 broken down by installation, grade(s) requested, and projected school(s) to attend
- Query each Soldier (accompanied or not) to determine any new requests for school support in SY 10
- Contact with all Soldiers that have a DEROS of 1 Jan 10 or earlier IOT determine the number of school-age family members will re-enroll in DoDD schools (all grades) in each Garrison (Area).
- Submit data to EUSA G1 commencing 30 Mar 09 with subsequent reports bi-weekly every Monday with the last report on 27 May 2009



Human Resources Assistance Team (HRAT)



- Provide Pen-wide HR Assistance to the HR Community and Leaders
- Conduct Staff Assistance Visits (SAV) to Brigade/Division S1
- ICW EUSA G4, conduct Command Inspections at the BDE S1 level of operations
- Process Centralized Promotion and Selection boards for EUSA (pre-board responsibility remains with BDE S1)
- EMILPO Personnel Automation Section (PAS) Chief



DIMHRS



- DIMHRS is no longer a DOD system; it is now an Army System
- The timeline for DIMHRS implementation has not been re-established
- Business Transformation Agency (BTA) to complete the DIMHRS “core” capabilities and pass it to the Army NLT 31 AUG 09
- The DIMHRS implementation team has 18-24 months (from receipt of core) to implement DIMHRS
- The EUSA HR/FI community must remain involved with the DIMHRS Campaign



DIMHRS ADMINISTRATORS (DA)



Responsibilities:

- Assigning and monitoring system access roles and permissions
- Resetting user's password or reactivating a locked account, as necessary
- Providing limited system support to their organizations for technical/database related issues
- Ensuring the approval process for the issuance/deletion of roles are adhered to



DIMHRS ADMINISTRATORS (DA)



Who should be a DA?

- DA appointment is a command decision
 - Will not be issued any functional roles (conflict of interest and violates separation of duties)
- Recommended selection criteria:
 - Grade appropriate to level of responsibility for military, civilian and contract personnel
 - Information Technology background preferred
 - MOS/Job Series is immaterial
 - 42A requiring a functional role will not be a DA



EMILPO

- EMILPO is still the database of record for personnel systems
- Each Brigade authorized two PAS Chief's
- Units will continue to monitor EMILPO reports
- Unit PAI is a great tool used to reconcile your AAA-162
- Unit Personnel Accountability Notices are not being monitored
 - Failure to Gain (AAA-165)
 - Expired DEROS
 - Currently over 400 EXPIRED DEROS in Korea!!
- EUSA G1 PAS (CW3 Geiger) provides services to the BDE S1/MPD; not the company-level orderly room clerk

Unit Mail Rooms



- All inspections use checklist in DOD 4525.6–M, Volume II, Appendix C. This form will be kept on file for one year.
- Unit postal officer will conduct
 - Daily checks of unit mailroom to include:
 - Verifying that accountable mail is received and accounted for
 - Ensuring mail is treated properly
 - Quarterly checks of each unit, staff section, or agency which only receives mail to ensure mail orderlies are performing their duties properly
 - Monthly self-inspection



Inspections

- During monthly self inspections Unit Postal Officers will:
 - Validate that postal records are properly maintained
 - Check items on hand to assure prompt and accurate delivery and forwarding
 - Inspect unit mailroom security
 - Ensure adequate supply of DA Form 3955 (Change of Address and Directory Card) is available
 - Review directory files to ensure accuracy of location
- 19th AG Company (Postal) will conduct unannounced inspections on a quarterly basis
- Units which are rated unsatisfactory will be re-inspected within 30 working days
- Repeated failure of postal inspection will



Common findings



- Unit mail handler cards are out of date
- Access roster is out of date
- Mail boxes have accumulated mail over 30 days old

- Access to the site is by verified registration only

 - Site administrator must load the following information into the database:
 - Last Name
 - First Name
 - Last four of SSN
 - UIC
 - Only Soldiers and Civilians that are registered users can sponsor a Family member for access to the site
 - Site administrator will need access to the above Soldier and Civilian data in order to make the site accessible to interested parties
- Command Input
 - The FRG is the Commander's program
 - The vFRG should reflect the vision of the Commander
 - Request periodic input from the Command team
