

PROGRAMS

- Education: Parenting Class (STEP), Pre-marriage Class.
- Training: Cross-cultural Issues, Cultural Shock, Suicide Prevention and Awareness, Sexual Harassment, Stress Management, Anger Control, Transition Workshop, Grief Recovery Workshop, Staying in Touch.
- Counseling: Individual, Married Couple, Family, Group.
- Outreach Program for Individually and Command Sponsored Family Members.
- Retreats: Getting Together Again, a New World Adventure, and Marriage Enrichment.
- Suicide Prevention Councils, AFTB (Army Family Team Building) Class, Health Promotion Council, Food Bank Program, NEO & FACMT (Domestic Violence Council), Family Life Resource Materials (books, tapes).



CHAPLAIN OUTREACH PROGRAM



- To support individually and command sponsored military and DoD civilian family members to promote quality of life.
- To enhance family readiness without placing total burden on the individual soldier's command and other military helping agencies. Outreach Coordinators (ORC) serve as ministry multipliers in the community.



OUTREACH COORDINATORS



- **Scope**

- Through a non-personal service contract, one Korean and one American Active Duty Military spouses are contracted for a military community. There are 13 locations.
- ORC collect information about the local military community and resources on the local economy outside the military installations.
- Focus is on informing families about sources of assistance, adding them in adapting to Korean culture and the military environment, and providing continuous support for a successful and meaningful stay in Korea.



OUTREACH COORDINATORS

- Support Group Activities
 - Wives' Support Group Meeting: Spiritual Fitness Groups, outing to local markets and recreational/cultural facilities.
 - Support to Single Soldiers: Visiting with bake goods & inviting to group dinner.
 - Other Group Activities: Mother-children play group, spouse group, picnics, group sports, and orphanage visits.
 - Referral of identified serious cases to chaplains and other helping professionals.
- Skills and Training for ORC:
 - Communication Skill, Building support net work, Team Building, Stress Management, English-Korean Class, Cooking Class (American & Korean), Legal Issue Class, Leadership Training, etc.
