 CIVIL ADMINISTRATION OF TAESONG-DONG

1. PURPOSE. This regulation prescribes policy and assigns responsibilities to staff sections and other agencies or commands for the civil administration of Taesong-dong (Freedom Village).
2. SCOPE. Consistent with provisions of the Armistice Agreement, this regulation is applicable to all UNC military and civilian personnel and to residents of Taesong-dong. It is equally applicable to all other persons or groups, military or civilian, desiring access to Taesong-dong.
3. EXPLANATION OF TERMS.
 - a. Taesong-dong. An area within the southern portion of the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) including a village at coordinates BT963013 and surrounding farmlands extending from coordinates BT956025 southward along Military Demarcation Line (MDL) to coordinates BS965992; then eastward to coordinates BS978991; southward along dirt road to coordinates BS981983; northeastward along dirt road to coordinates BS991992; then along southern boundary to DMZ to coordinates CT005007; northeastward to coordinates BT994025; and returning westerly along the MDL to coordinates BT956025.
 - b. Civil administration. The management of governmental affairs in Taesong-dong.
 - c. Civil affairs operations. Those actions that provide for the enforcement of compliance with the Armistice Agreement, the maintenance of internal security, and assistance and relief which contribute to the cultural and economic development and well-being of the people and area.
 - d. Security. Those measures taken to deter or counter infiltration or entry by unauthorized persons into the portion of the DMZ subject to UNC control, but does not include measures of internal security as indicated in para 4g(4) and 3c.
 - e. Civil affairs team. A 41-member team of military personnel organized to perform the command's civil affairs activities within Taesong-dong. The team is comprised of one ROKA LNO (CPT) and one KATUSA NCO (E-8), and 39 KATUSA soldiers (E-3/E-5) under the operational control of the Cdr, UNCSG-JSA.
4. RESPONSIBILITIES. The Commander in Chief, United Nations Command (CINCUNC) is responsible, under the Armistice Agreement, for civil administration and relief in the southern portion of the DMZ. The tasks required in accomplishing this responsibility are assigned as follows:
 - a. Cdr, 8th PERSCOM (Prov) will:
 - (1) Screen civil affairs team replacement personnel.
 - (a) Each team member should have training or experience in one or more of the following functional fields with each listed function being represented on the team: Public Administration, Public Health/Sanitation, Public/Law Enforcement, Agriculture, Economic and Civil Engineering.
 - (b) The team leader and NCOIC will be proficient in the English language.
 - (2) Establish a system of staggered rotations to insure minimum change of civil affairs team personnel at any one time.
 - b. ACofS, J-5 will advise and assist in the development of plans and policies for the civil administration of Taesong-dong.
 - c. Secretary, UNC Military Armistice Commission will:
 - (1) Maintain a current "United Nations Command Guide for the Civil Administration of Taesong-dong" prescribing plans and policies for the administration of Taesong-dong.
 - (2) Insure compliance with UNC policies and implement UNC plans for the administration of Taesong-dong.
 - (3) Coordinate Taesong-dong administrative requirements with other UNC staff agencies as required.

*This regulation supersedes UNC/CFC/USFK Reg 526-2, 24 August 1979.

(4) Except as indicated in subparagraph 4g(5), below, act as approving authority for visits to Taesong-dong by all other personnel authorized entry by the Armistice Agreement.

d. Judge Advocate will advise and assist in the administration of justice and the methods of selecting village officials in Taesong-dong.

e. Provost Marshal USFK will advise and assist as required by UNCMAC in the maintenance of law and order in Taesong-dong.

f. Cdr, Combined Field Army (ROK/US) (CFA (ROK/US)) will:

(1) Provide for the security of Taesong-dong in coordination with Cdr, UNCSG-JSA, and Secretary, UNCMAC.

(2) Upon request of Cdr, UNCSG-JSA provide (within capabilities) material, equipment and personnel in support of disaster relief and civic actions projects aimed at furthering the development of Taesong-dong. Maintain a POC at CFA (ROK/US) level to coordinate this support.

g. Cdr, UNCSG-JSA will:

(1) Conduct civil affairs operations in Taesong-dong IAW the plans and policies prescribed in the "United Nations Command Guide for the Civil Administration of Taesong-dong."

(2) Determine the overall suitability of personnel nominated to the civil affairs team and reject those not qualified.

(3) Recommend changes for the improvement of administrative procedures within Taesong-dong to Secretary, UNCMAC.

(4) Provide internal security within the village proper in coordination with Cdr, CFA (ROK/US).

(5) Issue temporary DMZ passes to ROK Nationals requiring entrance to Taesong-dong after receiving confirmation of ROK Government clearance.

(6) Maintain coordination with Paju-gun officials.

(7) Supervise and validate the election of the Mayor of Taesong-dong.

(8) Approve the annual budget of Taesong-dong

5. POLICIES. a. Complete freedom of movement within Taesong-dong is granted under the Armistice Agreement and Subsequent Agreements, to members of the Military Armistice Commission, Joint Observer Teams, Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission, and others specifically authorized to enter by the Military Armistice Commission.

b. Certain families are authorized to reside and earn a living in the DMZ by the terms of the Armistice Agreement and Subsequent Agreements as amplified by UNC Reg 551-4. There are no provisions currently to add families or individuals (with exception of school teachers) to the original list that was exchanged with north Korea in February 1954. Bonafide residents will retain their status only if they maintain a permanent home in Taesong-dong at least eight months out of each calendar year. Residents who move out of the village for more than four months in any calendar year (except to attend schooling) or who are hospitalized, taking care of children attending school outside Taesong-dong, or serving in the military will lose their right to live and work in Taesong-dong.

c. Although residents of Taesong-dong have freedom of movement during daylight hours within the farming area defined in paragraph 3a, above, they are expressly prohibited from entering the Joint Security Area, the camps of the Swiss and Swedish Delegations to the Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission, and military installations within the area without permission of the local commander.

6. REFERENCES. a. Armistice Agreement, Volume I, 27 July 1953 (paras 8, 9, and 10) and agreement in principle reached at the sixth meeting of the Military Armistice Commission, 3 August 1953, as periodically extended.

b. UNC Reg 551-4 (Armistice Affairs - Compliance with the Armistice Agreement).
