PROCEDURES FOR REQUESTING AND ALLOCATING ARMY AIRCRAFT
SUPPORT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE AND TACTICAL OPERATIONS
AND CIVIL/MILITARY EMERGENCIES

Justification. This interim change establishes policy changes for Aeromedical Evacuation Request.

Expiration. This interim change will expire when rescinded or superseded by a permanent change or revision of the regulation.

1. USFK Reg 95-4, 25 August 1992, is changed as follows:

Paragraph 9, AEROMEDICAL EVACUATION REQUESTS. Add the following at the end of the first sentence of subparagraph 9b(1). "and Korean civilian employees injured in the performance of duty."

Paragraph 9, AEROMEDICAL EVACUATION REQUESTS. In subparagraph 9b(2) delete the words "with the Chief of Staff, USFK or ACofS, J3" and replace with "Commander 18th MEDCOM".

2. Post this change per DA Pam 310-13.

3. File this interim change in front of the publication.

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SUPPORT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE AND TACTICAL OPERATIONS
AND CIVIL/MILITARY EMERGENCIES

SUPPLEMENTATION. Issue of further supplements to this regulation by subordinate commands is prohibited unless prior approval is obtained from HQ USFK, ATTN: EACJ-EA, Unit #15237, APO AP 96205-0010.

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*This regulation supersedes USFK Reg 95-4, 28 October 1988 and USFK Reg 95-15, 6 March 1991.

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1. PURPOSE. This regulation prescribes peacetime procedures for requesting Eighth United States Army (EUSA) aviation support for tactical, administrative (to include logistical operations), and civil/military emergency missions. Priorities are governed by DOD 4500.43-D.

2. APPLICABILITY. This regulation applies to Headquarters (HQ), United States Forces, Korea (USFK), component commands, visiting units, dignitaries, and forces under operational control of HQ USFK using EUSA aviation assets. This regulation also applies to all USFK and Republic of Korea (ROK) military personnel desiring United States (U.S.) aviation support when emergency conditions exist and life is in jeopardy. This regulation is not applicable to a combatant or hostile situation. In peacetime, the provisions of (S) UNC/CFC Reg 525-4 will be followed for aviation support in a hostile situation.

3. REFERENCES. Required and related publications are listed in appendix A.

4. EXPLANATION OF ABBREVIATIONS AND TERMS. Abbreviations used in this regulation are explained in the glossary.

5. RESPONSIBILITIES.

a. The Assistant Chief of Staff (ACofS), J3, will--

(1) Determine the allocation of aviation assets in support of ROK military services under the operational control of Commander in Chief, United Nations Command/Combined Forces Command (CINCUNC/CFC), in accordance with (IAW) DOD 4515.13-R and 10 USC 2213.

(2) Resolve questions of priority with the EUSA Aviation Officer and Director, ROK Army Aviation, when requests exceed aircraft availability.

b. The Commander, 7th Air Force, will provide operational support airlift as defined in DOD 4500.43-D and as outlined in PACAF Reg 55-63.

(1) 7th Air Force operational support airlift assets consist of two C-12 aircraft that are owned, operated, and maintained by the Military Airlift Command. 7th Air Force has operational and scheduling authority over these two Korea-based aircraft.

(2) Operational support airlift requests will be submitted to the Commander, 7th Air Force/DOUF, APO AP 96278-5000, via PACAF Form 292 (Support Airlift Aircraft Mission Request), USFK Form 84-R (Aircraft Mission Request), or by electronic message, a minimum of 14 days prior to the desired travel date for normal scheduling consideration. Requests received on shorter notice may be scheduled using existing mission schedules IAW PACAF Reg 55-63. USFK Form 84-R (appendix B) will be locally reproduced on 8 1/2- by 11-inch paper.

c. The Commander, 17th Aviation Brigade, will--

(1) Support the tactical, logistical, and administrative operations of United Nations Command (UNC)/Combined Forces Command (CFC)/USFK, including military units, other nation forces, and subordinate commands under the operational control of CINCUNC/CFC or Commander, USFK.

(2) Coordinate distinguished visitor missions with the protocol office and visitors bureau.

6. PASSENGER ELIGIBILITY/APPROVAL AUTHORITY.

a. Subparagraphs 6b through 6l discuss eligible passengers and approval authority. A list of passengers authorized to travel onboard U.S. Army aircraft is shown in appendix C. All passengers must meet eligibility and approval requirements IAW DOD 4515.13-R.

b. Active duty U.S. military personnel on official U.S. Government business are authorized travel in ROK aircraft during joint and combined training exercises when invited by ROK aviation commanders (approval by ROK unit commander).

c. Within the ROK, active duty U.S. and ROK military members of HQ UNC/CFC are authorized travel in U.S. Army aircraft for military duties that primarily benefit the U.S. Armed Forces (approval by unit commander).

d. Allied active duty military personnel, not assigned to HQ UNC/CFC, are authorized travel on U.S. Army aircraft under the following conditions:

(1) Personnel must possess identification as prescribed by their military service.

(2) Travel must be associated with military exercises or U.S. Army tactical or training missions conducted wholly within the ROK (approval by unit commander).

e. Retired U.S. military personnel are authorized space-available travel on U.S. Army aircraft (approval by unit commander). Travel to establish a home, for personal gain in connection with a business enterprise, or for employment not authorized.

f. Department of Defense (DOD) dependents are authorized travel on U.S. Army aircraft IAW DOD 4515.13-R, subparagraphs 4-7 and 11-4.

g. Foreign national military and civilian personnel not involved in a military exercise may be authorized travel in U.S. Army aircraft when such travel is in the primary interest of DOD. Approved travel orders or travel authorization is required. Submit requests as outlined in paragraph 7 (must be approved by Commander, USFK).

h. To travel on a military aircraft, civilian DOD employees must have a valid DOD identification (ID) card, DD Form 1173 (Uniformed Services Identification and Privilege Card), and Korean National USFK employees must have a valid USFK Form 37EK (USFK ID Pass) or travel orders (TO)/travel authorization (TA) in their possession. TO/TA may be in memorandum format. The authority to issue orders

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for travel on military aircraft is delegated to the following USFK subordinate commands and assigned units: 2d Infantry Division (2ID); 17th Aviation Brigade; 18th Medical Command (MEDCOM); 19th Support Command; 501st Military Intelligence Brigade; U.S. Army Korea Contracting Agency; 8th Military Police Brigade; 8th Personnel Command; 1st Signal Brigade; 7th Region Criminal Investigation Division; Army Materiel Command; U.S. Army Engineer District, Far East; and Armed Forces Korea Network.

i. Employees of contractors may travel on military aircraft when the government contract states that the U.S. Government will provide transportation (approval by unit commander).

j. Personnel of allied military forces and governmental or private agencies must reimburse the U.S. Government for use of EUSA aviation assets when travel directly benefits those forces/agencies. DOD 4515.13-R prescribes the procedures for obtaining authorization.

k. For passengers not covered in paragraph 6, travel requests must be submitted through the Commander, EUSA, ATTN: EACJ-EA, Unit #15236, APO AP 96205-0009, to Commander, USFK, ATTN: FKCJ, Unit #15237, APO AP 96205-0010, for Commander USFK approval. (NOTE: If the flight is for a very important person, the request must also be submitted through the USFK Protocol Office). Requests will state purpose and justification for the mission and will be submitted not later than 15 working days prior to the requested flight.

l. All passengers are required to have ID cards and hearing protection. Active duty U.S. military personnel must wear personnel ID tags and the appropriate military uniform unless other clothing is authorized by their unit commander. Passengers will not carry their medical or dental records onboard the aircraft unless their servicing medical facilities maintain duplicate copies.

7. MISSION REQUEST PROCEDURES. Once passenger eligibility has been determined and proper authority obtained, submit mission requests as follows:

a. Staff sections and activities of HQ USFK will submit USFK Forms 84-R through the Secretary Combined Joint Staff to the 17th Aviation Brigade, S3, Unit #15270, APO AP 96205-0043, 7 working days prior to the date of the mission.

b. Subordinate commands and activities of USFK/EUSA without organic aircraft will submit USFK Forms 84-R to the 17th Aviation Brigade, S3, Unit #15270, APO AP 96205-0043, 7 working days prior to the date of mission.

c. 2ID units will submit requests to the 2ID Aviation Officer, Unit #15041, APO AP 96224-0289, on the appropriate 2ID Form.

d. ROK-U.S. CFC and USFK units will follow procedures outlined in UNC/CFC/USFK Memo 95-1. The ROK government will reimburse the U.S. Government for ROK/CFC travel in excess of ROK contributions to the HQ CFC travel budget.

e. Tactical support missions are those flown in support of real world operations in defense of the ROK regardless of current defense conditions (DEFCON). Tactical support missions include, but are not limited to, sensitive logistical cargo transport operations and other missions of operational necessity as designated by CINCUNC/CFC. Requests will include at a minimum, unit identification, call signs, frequencies, points of contact, and telephone numbers of the supported unit.

f. Training requests will be submitted to the 17th Aviation Brigade, S3, Unit #15270, APO AP 96205-0043, not later than 45 days prior to a planned tactical training exercise. This allows the liaison officers (LOs) from supporting aviation units to join ground elements and participate in exercise planning.

g. Any required aircrew temporary duty costs will be funded by the supported activity/agency.

h. Administrative and logistic support requests beyond the capability of a major subordinate commander's organic assets will be submitted to the 17th Aviation Brigade, S3, Unit #15270, APO AP 96205-0043, on USFK Form 84-R, 7 working days prior to date of mission.

i. When the destination is less than 2 hours driving time, air transportation will not be requested except for general officers, sensitive logistical cargo, or when exceptional circumstances are involved.

j. Authorized personnel desiring transportation from Seoul to Taegu or Taegu to Seoul may contact the Seoul Transportation Management Office or the Taegu Transportation Management Office to reserve seating on the C-12 shuttle. Shuttle operations are Monday through Friday; two round trips daily. (USFK Reg 55-355.)

k. The following policies apply:

(1) The supporting aviation organization may consolidate requests for travel by different agencies to a common destination.

(2) Passengers will be on time for scheduled flights. If passengers do not arrive within 20 minutes after scheduled departure time, the flight will be cancelled except for general officers and equivalent rank. Ground time for intermediate stops by the C-12 will normally not exceed 30 minutes except for general officers or equivalent rank.

(3) All requestors will notify the supporting aviation organization when scheduled support is no longer required.

l. All Army aviation support requests to transport very important personnel that require approval by the Commander, USFK, will be routed IAW subparagraphs 6k(1) through (3).

8. DEFCON 4 PRIORITIES. During DEFCON 4, the priorities shown in table 1 will be used for aircraft support within the geographical boundaries of the ROK.

9. AEROMEDICAL EVACUATION REQUESTS.

a. USFK Reg 40-4 outlines procedures to be followed when determining specific medical evacuation (MEDEVAC) support requirements.

b. MEDEVAC requests will be processed as follows:

(1) DOD service personnel, their dependents, U.S. Embassy and consular personnel, and Korean Augmentation to the U.S. Army personnel. MEDEVAC requests for these patients, regardless of patient category or the flying conditions, are processed through appropriate medical channels to the 377th Medical Company.

Requests inadvertently channeled into the Command Center Seoul or EUSA elements will be passed directly to the 377th Medical Company.

(2) Non-DOD civilians, ROK military, and foreign nationals. These patients are processed as described in subparagraph 9b(1), with the Chief of Staff, USFK or ACoS, J3, having approval authority IAW DOD 4515.13-R, subparagraph 11-7b(4). The following criteria will be strictly adhered to in determining transportation eligibility:

(a) The patient's illness or injury is an immediate threat to the patient's life.

(b) The patient is situated where medical capabilities for adequate diagnosis and treatment, under generally accepted medical standards, are not available.

(c) Suitable commercial or ROK military transportation is not available.

c. If professional medical advice is needed to determine the validity of the request, the Command Center Seoul duty team will contact the USFK Surgeon at 121st Evacuation Hospital.

d. The agency requesting MEDEVAC support should use USFK Form 107EK-R (MEDEVAC Request Worksheet) to provide USFK Form 107EK-R information to the 377th Medical Company. USFK Form 107EK-R (appendix D) will be locally reproduced on 8 1/2- by 11-inch paper.

10. CIVIL/EMERGENCY MEDICAL REQUEST PROCEDURES.

a. The Command Center Seoul will--

(1) Accept and evaluate requests for civil emergency aviation support. If the request is for ROK support, Command Center Seoul will refer it to the ROK Army Tactical Operations Center (ROKATOC) through the ROK Joint Chiefs of Staff Duty Director of Operations. ROKATOC will then coordinate with ROK civil and military authorities for support. If ROK civil or military support is unavailable and it is determined that U.S. support may be required, ROKATOC will advise the Command Center Seoul duty officer. The duty officer will then obtain Commander, USFK approval.

(2) Provide advance notification immediately to the EUSA Aviation Officer during duty hours or the 18th MEDCOM duty officer during nonduty hours, that an emergency situation is being processed by ROKATOC which may require U.S. Army aviation support.

(3) Obtain the necessary Republic of Korea Tactical Zone (RK) P-73 clearance from the Capital Defense Command through the ROK Duty Director of Operations if the request is for U.S. Army aviation support inside RK P-73.

(4) Obtain approval IAW subparagraph 9b(2).

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(5) Pass the approved request for aviation support to the EUSA Aviation Officer during duty hours or the 18th MEDCOM duty officer during nonduty hours. The request will include--

- (a) Support requested.
- (b) Location.
- (c) The RK P-73 clearance (if applicable).
- (d) Name and title of requesting officer at Command Center Seoul.

(6) Contact the 7th Air Force Senior Operations Duty Officer at the Tactical Air Control Center to notify U.S. Air Forces, Korea and the Korea Combined Rescue Coordination Center, if--

- (a) Requesting support in excess of EUSA aviation capabilities.
- (b) The request is in support of U.S. forces other than the U.S. Army during aircraft accidents.
- (c) The request is in support of civil or military disasters (flood relief, mass casualty).

(7) Requests for U.S. Air Forces, Korea support will include--

- (a) Name, title, and telephone number of requesting official.
- (b) Location, time of occurrence, and nature of emergency.
- (c) Number and nationality of personnel involved.

(8) Obtain the following information, at a minimum, from the ROK controlling unit at the scene through the ROK LO when ROK and U.S. assets will be committed simultaneously:

- (a) Identification of controlling unit at the scene.
- (b) Location of the controlling unit.
- (c) Point of contact at the scene.
- (d) All necessary frequencies and call signs being used by the controlling unit.
- (e) The identity of other aircraft committed to the emergency, by type, number, and call sign.
- (f) The RK P-73 clearance if required.
- (g) Any special instructions.

b. The EUSA Aviation Officer (or designated representative) will--

(1) Determine whether EUSA aircraft can support the mission. If the request is for U.S. support, designate the unit that will provide support and inform the ACofS, J3, of the situation.

(2) Alert the selected aviation unit to prepare for the mission but not to dispatch the aircraft until the applicable steps in subparagraphs 10a(3) through 10a(6), are completed and the unit has received the information. In cases where the 377th Medical Company has been designated, all coordination will be made through the Commander, 18th MEDCOM.

(3) Obtain the identity, call sign, and frequency of the air traffic control agency or unit controlling the aircraft participating in the emergency from Command Center Seoul and inform the supporting aviation unit.

(4) Confirm clearance has been given if operations are to be inside the RK P-73. Provide the supporting unit the frequency and call sign of the controlling agency or the air-to-air frequency and call sign of other participating aviation units.

(5) Inform the Command Center Seoul duty officer of action taken.

(6) Inform the Command Center Seoul duty officer if the request for EUSA aviation support is in excess of its capabilities.

11. ON-SCENE CONTROLLING AGENCY. In case of a major emergency when ROK and U.S. assets are committed simultaneously, the controlling agency will be the ROK unit at the scene as designated by the ROK Joint Chiefs of Staff. The U.S. unit designated to support the ROK is authorized to coordinate directly with the controlling unit and exchange LOs as required.

12. YONGSAN HELIPORT, H-208. The Yongsan heliport will be used for all MEDEVAC missions going to the 121st Evacuation Hospital. Yongsan tower is the controlling air traffic control agency during normal operating hours and Flight Operations Center South during other times. Refer to the current DOD Flip, (Visual Flight Rules, Arrival/Departure Routes Korea) for proper arrival/departure instructions.

13. AFTERACTION REPORT. The U.S. unit providing aviation support during the civil or military emergency will forward an afteraction report to the Commander, EUSA, ATTN: EACJ-EA, Unit #15236, APO AP 96205-0009, within 20 days of completing the mission. (RCS exempt: AR 355-15, subparagraph 5-2c(7).)

14. SURVEILLANCE OR PHOTOGRAPHIC REQUESTS. Requests for aircraft to provide surveillance or photographic missions will be submitted to the Commander, USFK, ATTN: FKJ2-CM, Unit #15237, APO AP 96205-0010.

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15. HELICOPTER FIRE FIGHTING ASSISTANCE. EUSA has the capability to fight fires by helicopter "waterdrops" with CH-47 and UH-60 aircraft. This capability is only extended to range fires caused by U.S. Army actions and only after all other fire fighting methods have been exhausted. Helicopter fire fighting assistance **WILL NOT** be used to fight volatile or hazardous material fires or fires in built-up areas. Coordination for support will be made through fire fighting channels to the appropriate aviation agency IAW subparagraph 15d. Support for fighting other than fires caused by U.S. Army actions will be reimbursed IAW 10 USC 2213 and the U.S. Army Program Budget Guidance.

a. EUSA currently has 14 Bambi Buckets (helicopter fire fighting devices) for use by EUSA aviation units. Specific quantities are--

c. The storing fire station will be responsible for maintaining the buckets and providing them to the aviation unit for training. The primary aviation user will establish standing operating procedures, conduct qualification and currency training, and ensure the bucket/aircraft interface is completed IAW the operators manual. Operators manuals are located at each of the storing fire stations.

d. Request for use of the buckets will be made through normal fire fighting channels. Approval authority for aviation fire fighting missions is--

(1) Fires in the 2ID area or fires originating as a result of 2ID actions - Commander, 2ID, or designated representative.

(2) Fires originating as a result of 17th Aviation Brigade actions - Commander, 17th Aviation Brigade.

(3) All other request for fire fighting support will be made through the appropriate channels to J/G3, Aviation Division, during duty hours and Command Center Seoul after duty hours for the ACofS, J/G3, approval.


16. CONFLICTS. All questions or conflict concerning air transportation eligibility or approval authority for transportation on DOD-owned and controlled aircraft will be resolved IAW 10 USC 2213. DOD 4515.13-R will have precedence over any inconsistent guidance in this regulation.
