MSC-K has a long and proud history of winning DA level awards and recognitions for maintenance and supply excellence. In addition to this, MSC-K provides sustainment support across all six tactical logistics functions (fix, move, man, arm, sustain, and fuel) to U.S. forces across Korea. MSC-K is headquartered at Camp Carroll near Waegwan and consists of a Soldier and Civilian team which synchronizes the efforts of its Industrial Base at Waegwan and Busan along with its four battalions—6th Ordnance Battalion (HQ at Camp Carroll), 25th Movement Control Battalion (HQ at Camp Henry), 498th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion (HQ at Camp Carroll), and the Korean Service Corps Battalion (HQ at Camp Kim). Although the majority of these battalions are headquartered at or near Daegu, they operate from and provide support to all areas within Korea; or as we like to say, “Support from the DMZ to the Sea.”

I want your arrival to MSC-K, Team 19, and Korea to be as smooth as possible. Documents necessary to have upon arrival into Korea include: copies of your PCS orders, medical and dental records, and a copy of your last evaluation.
